INTERVENTION WHO SHOULD ATTEND

**Program Description:** Response to Intervention can be defined as a schoolwide prevention framework that integrates assessment and intervention to improve student outcomes. While much of RtI research and attention has focused on elementary models, RtI implementation at the middle school level is gaining momentum and increased attention. Implementing RtI in Middle School is an all-day workshop designed to provide RtI middle school teams with information and resources needed to effectively implement a multi-level intervention model in their school. Attention will be devoted to examining various RtI models at the middle school level with respect to scheduling for supplemental intervention, screening, and progress monitoring.

About the Presenter: Matthew Burns, is currently Associate Dean for Research and Professor within the School of Education at the University of Missouri. Prior to his current position, he was an Associate Professor in the Department of Educational Psychology at the University of Minnesota. His research focuses on improving instruction for children with varying abilities and disabilities. Dr. Burns explores the application of learning and ecological theories to assessment and subsequent instruction, and is interested in systemic change to reform the education of children with unique learning needs through measuring children's response to intervention. He has written numerous articles, books, and book chapters related to these research interests.
