





Selecting Appropriate Texts S

- Text should be at weaker reader's level
 - No more than 10 errors per 100 words
- Each pair may read from DIFFERENT text
 - Within the pair, students read the same text



Selecting appropriate texts is critical to the success of PALS

Scheduling PALS S

- Implement PALS:
 - -2-3 times per week
 - 35-45 minutes per session
 - for at least 16-18 weeks



- Implement PALS at a regular time.
 - Same time each day.
 - Same days each week.



- Follow the PALS scripts (doesn't need to be verbatim, but should cover the same content)
- Use the PALS materials
 - Question Card
 - Correction Card
 - Point Sheet
- Ensure that students are "getting it."
- Reteach as needed.
- Implement PALS 3 times per week.


